**Kevin Kavanagh** is an independent space promoting, facilitating and nurturing artists to exhibit works that are meaningful and contemporary. The gallery represents Irish and International artists at home and abroad.

**Taylor Galleries** were founded by John Taylor in 1978, showing a selection of leading Irish contemporary and 20th century Irish painting, sculpture and print.

**Hillsboro Fine Art**, is directed by John Daly. Hillsboro Fine Art has hosted first solo exhibitions in Ireland by many renowned international artists. Its principal focus is on promoting Irish artists represented by the gallery.

**Galway Arts Centre** is dedicated to providing year-round access to the arts in an inclusive, welcoming hub in the heart of Galway City. Programmes feature visual art exhibitions, events, films, music, literature, workshops, residencies, festivals, theatre and performance.

**The Royal Ulster Academy** is an artist led organisation which aims to celebrate, enrich and expand contemporary approaches to the visual arts. It was originally founded as The Belfast Rambler's Sketching Club in 1879, became the Ulster Academy of Arts in 1930, and finally the Royal Ulster Academy in 1950.

And to the many artists and their friends who have delivered works to various locations in Ireland. The 2023 exhibition is curated by leading Irish artist Sinéad Ní Mhaonaigh with Sarah Searson and Laura Mahon.

The work is in the long hall and here that's in every sense. It's about the history of the event, the continuity, and the pleasure of encountering artworks, which through new proximities add meaning; like voices in a choir. Large scale exhibitions like these, which host over a hundred art works, are about the showing and the sense of festival. King House is a beautiful space for art, and it is also a place with a complex and fascinating history. In the context of Boyle Arts Festival, the exhibition is about getting together and the delight and possibility of being in community with each other, being together with art and artists.

Here, in the presence of a large group show, we witness the incredible highs of making something work, getting it to gel, align, or jar. We might also be alert to that uncertainty that artists experience, that concern that work is going nowhere. For the artist the detail is in the application, the habit, and that deep bond to making. That feeling, the paper is too thick, the canvas is wrong, too loose, too tight, the print is too big, that somehow you have drowned or overworked it. That questioning that something in the order has gone askew, a little tell, that shows you, the artist, your intentions were wrong. Then for no reason other than a sideways look, a new day, a conversation, a cut or some masking here or there, the application of a filter, a colour, a tiny polish and reshaping, and the whole thing works. You've pulled it together. You're back near some hotspot, near, but in a very different place from where you started. Not with new confidence, not with a profound revelation, but with a sense of renewed in the possibility of your work. A shift that could never be described. This is the enterprise; this is the practice. The long hall.

The work happens in solitary moments, and in exhibitions like these. In the being together, being side-by-side in orchestra, in tandem. There is a fabulousness in knowing your accidents, your disappointment and elation in attempting to create something that could fail, that is what pushes you on and into something new. The work, could be in the scrape of the knife on the board, or in that very odd brown that comes from over worked paint. The glimmers are in how it all came together and how finally somewhere towards an end point, you stop, and think, I've got this.

The making is in all your things noticed and attended to or ignored, it's in the observations, in tiny little moments move into meaning. The connections are in the common things, in the unseen things, we know are lurking in us, embedded in us, in what we can describe when we hit on something we didn't even know was there. So here we are, in the presence of all this energy, in King House, and in the beautiful town of Boyle.

### **FERGUS AHERN AWARD**

It is due to the vision and determination of Fergus Ahern that the Boyle Arts Festival and the Civic Collection of Art endure so well today. In grateful recognition of this, 2023 sees the presentation of the 4th Annual Fergus Ahern Award for merit, to an artist with work in the main exhibition.
